HEALEYS TO THE COAST

November 1-4, 2026

The coastal trip is planned for Sunday, 11/1 – 11/4 in historic and beautiful Beaufort, NC. Some of you remember the wonderful trip we had several years ago. I had planned to have this trip in Southport, NC; however, after much deliberation, I decided to go back to Beaufort. Southport does not have any hotels within walking distance of the downtown. During that time of the year, both areas have many tourists making driving and parking much too difficult.

I have arranged for us to stay at the Inlet Inn, on the water front of Beaufort. Those who stayed there in the past recall the wonderful location and accommodations. We have blocked 15 rooms of varying configurations for 3 nights, Sunday November 1-4, 2026 (checking out on Wednesday 11/4). The room rates vary from \$169 - \$199/night, plus taxes and fees totaling 12.75%. Guests staying three nights will enjoy Sunday night at 50% off the published direct book rate. They will extend a 10% discount to any guests staying fewer than three nights. The higher rate rooms are mostly 2nd floor, waterfront, king, with a balcony looking over Taylors Creek. Guests can review their property online (inlet-inn.com) and then book your room by **calling directly at 252-728-3600** and providing the name, "CAHC". Each guest will pay a required one-night deposit, which is fully refundable up to 48 hours before arrival (3pm two days before check-in).

The rate includes free onsite parking, and continental breakfast. The Inlet Inn is located within walking distance of all shops and restaurants. On arrival and departure days, guests are welcome to park in their lot before check-in (3 pm) and after check-out (11 am) to extend the Beaufort experience!

Make your reservation soon, as I mentioned, the tourist season never ends in Beaufort, and the Fall time of the year draws many there.

We will depart from a location TBD on Sunday, 11/1 @ 9:30am) for the North Carolina group. Anyone coming from the Columbia area may want to meet at a desired location on the route. The route currently planned is leaving Charlotte to Hwy 74. Provided earlier storms/hurricanes have not occurred and wiped out back road bridges, we will catch I-95 for a short distance (6 miles) to Lumberton (Exit 22), where we will take a break/lunch, and go to Hwy 41 for a long country road ride to Hwy 24 (Jacksonville, NC). Once on Hwy 24, it will take us directly to Beaufort. The ride is normally about 5-6 hours (not counting rest stops, etc.)

After arriving in Beaufort, we will have pizza and refreshments delivered to the Lookout Lounge in the hotel. On Monday, it will be a relaxing day on your own to enjoy Beaufort or trip in the area to visit some of the sites. Mid-afternoon, we will have an oyster roast and refreshments at the hotel courtyard, before going to dinner. Since there are multiple places to dine, we can either go together to one place, or you can choose your own place of interest. On Tuesday morning, we will leave Beaufort for a trip to Washington, NC (approx. 1.5 hours). The route will take us through backroads along the coastal area. After catching a 30-minute ferry (from Cherry Branch to Minnesot Beach), we will drive through places such as, Oriental, Bayboro, Hobucken, Aurora, etc., before arriving in Washington for lunch and shopping. Leaving Washington, we will drive to New Bern for a short stop and then back to Beaufort. Charles has connections with Cherry Point Marine Air Base, and is trying to get us in to watch some F16's do their thing.

After arriving back in Beaufort, we will all walk to dinner at one of the restaurants. You will order from the menu, no planned meals.

Please drive your Healey's. The hotel staff is very excited about seeing our cars. When we arrive, I would like to parade us down Main St.. Plus, we want to have a photo op location with all the cars.

We will depart on Wednesday for home.

The Undo Stick will save a lot of bending, pounding and potential damage to your knock offs and anything else in the way when you remove a tire.

Undo-Stick User Guide

Congratulations and Thank You for being the proud owner of an Undo-Stick! Just a few notes on the proper and safe use of your new tool...

O When using the Undo-Stick your car should be on a flat surface under its full weight, in-gear with the parking brake engaged

O Orient the tool with the logo facing outward and the label THIS SIDE TOWARD WHEEL inward (Tool orientation is essential, for the Undo-Stick for Jaguar due to the tool offset)

O Place the tool on the knock-off as shown in the photos below

O Hold the handle close to the fender to ensure proper engagement of the tool

R When removing a wheel loosen the knock-off with the tool approximately one turn then raise the car and remove the knock-off by hand

O When installing a wheel tighten the knock-off hand tight then lower the car and tighten the knock-off with the tool

Tips

If you find that the end of the handle hits the floor while engaging or turning the knock-off, flip the tool 180° and engage the opposite ear of the knock-off. There is no orientation of the knock-off wherein you cannot engage the tool

Occasionally, the front wheels will steer themselves under the torque of using the Undo-Stick. This is more likely when the tool handle starts in the vertical orientation. Here are some suggested remedies

C, Hold the handle closer to the fender to minimize torque steer

O Roll the car a bit so the wheel rotates the Undo-Stick off the vertical

O Have an assistant hold the steering wheel steady

O Stick a "broomstick" thru the steering wheel spokes to prevent it from turning

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Safety

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NEVER JUMP OR STAND ON THE HANDLE OF YOUR UNDO-STICK!

Periodically check that all the fasteners on the tool are tight inspect the tool for damage or signs of wear, especially cracks in the handle. Don't use it if damaged. (Small dents in the plastic bobbins and large end of the handle after use are normal. Undo-Sticks undergo 100% load testing so some small dents in a new tool is normal)

If your car is expected to be off the ground with the wheels loose for any length of time, place a note on the windscreen or steering wheel reminding you to tighten the wheels before driving off

We trust that you will have many years of use of the Undo-Stick
